- 1 This is an appeal of a grant of summary judgment by the district court to the United States (on cross-motions for summary judgment) in an action brought by the government to enjoin enforcement of an ordinance of the City of Blue Ash, Ohio prescribing the course to be taken by aircraft when taking off from the Cincinnati--Blue Ash Airport.
